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#### Dear Handball Friends,

The Argentine Handball Federation will be the host of the IV Men's Youth World Championship this August. It will be the second IHF World Championship in Argentina after the Men's Junior World Championship in 1995. And it will be a great pleasure for the International Handball Family to be in South America. Argentina nowadays is in the focus of international handball, not only after the Men's World Championship in Sweden, when the Argentine team played an outstanding tournament, finished as best Non-European team and beat host Sweden in an amazing game. The development of handball has improved since the current Men's team started as Youth and surprised the concurrence in Bahrain, ranking fourth in the end. This squad nowadays represents the hopes of Argentine handball, but the Youth Program of the Federation will bear rich fruits – not



only in this Youth World Championships. As the hopes for the participation at the Olympic Games in London are high in the country of the defending Pan American Champion, and as the Men's team plays highly successful, the general public interest in handball has increased rapidly in Buenos Aires and all over the country. Now a new generation of Argentine and international handball youngster will compete at the IV Youth World Championship. 20 teams from all over the world go for Gold, Silver and Bronze – but it is not only the fight for medals, but an initial point for the development of all players as it is their first intercontinental challenge on their way to Juniors and Seniors.

But it is also an important objective for the hosting nation Argentina: To organize a World Championship will bring our sport in the focus of fans, sponsors and media – and I hope this competition will be another great step for further development. The Argentine Federation is ready to take their chance to promote and to flourish. I'm convinced that the host will succeed in organizing a sporting event which is not only perfectly arranged, but also impressive and fair.

I wish all participating teams the very best of luck in the tournament and a good time ahead. And I hope that handball will receive the public interest and audience the young players worked hard for in the last years. The Argentine people are known as sports (and not only football) enthusiasts – they will cheer for their team, but also respect all the opponents in a fair and friendly manner.

The present brochure includes many details which have been compiled particularly for your purpose and which we hope might be of use to you. We would be pleased if this brochure helped you for your orientation within the IHF, and will additionally try to keep you well informed on a regular basis. #### CITY OF MAR DE PLATA

#### LOCATION

Mar del Plata is located 404 km south of Buenos Aires city on the coast of the Atlantic Ocean.

Population: 650.000 Surface: 1453 km Coast: 47 km

#### Access to Mar del Plata from Buenos Aires:

By Autovía 2 (freeway): 404 km. By Ruta 11 (road): 602 km. By Ruta 226: 441 km.

By car: 4 hours (Autovía 2)

By bus: 5 hours By train: 5.30 hours By plane: 45 minutes



The Astor Piazzolla international airport is located only 10 minutes away from downtown. Three airlines offer different national destinations with more than forty weekly flights that increase during the summer season. About four trains reach the city daily, and the trip from Buenos Aires takes around five hours.

The modern and safe Autovía 2 joins Buenos Aires city with Mar del Plata in a four-hour trip (404 km). Three roads (11, 88 and 226) also connect Mar del Plata with Buenos Aires and the rest of the country.

More than fifty bus companies link the city with the rest of the country. The journey from Buenos Aires lasts approximately 5 hours.

#### Hidrology

There are no rivers in General Pueyrredon district, still streams and lagoons arise from its topography, worth noting among them are: the Corrientes, Lobería, Seco, Chapadmalal, las Brusquitas, del Tigre, Boquerón, Ojo de Agua, la Ballenera, Huinco, Cardalito, las Chacras, la Tapera, los Cueros and del Barco streams; and de los Padres; Ponce; Santa Rosa and la Peregrina lagoons.

To the north of Mar del Plata, the cold currents of Malvinas Isles meet the warm Brazilian currents, affecting the aerologic conditions of the area.

Deep cold waters outcrop contributing with extraordinary nutrients, and thereby assuring the development of rich fish stocks

#### **HOTELS**

Mar del Plata counts on more than 550 hotels where to stay. In the city, but mainly along the coastline, hotels cater to all tastes and suit all budgets. Options range from luxury hotels of highly reputable cuisine, sea resorts, apart-hotels, mid-range hotels, hostels, estancias (cattle ranches) and country houses to cheap residential lodgings. Accommodation offer combines with gastronomic proposals, adventure tourism, excursions, show tickets, transfers to beach resorts, horse rides, golf, sea fishing, diving, and a wide variety of entertainment for children and teenagers. For those who enjoy life outdoors, there are camp sites in the ranges area, along the coastline, towards the south of Mar del Plata and as far as Miramar city. Even some camp sites can be found along Ruta 226





(road). They offer enough place to put up a tent, park the car or the caravan, and most count on bungalows and facilities such as swimming pools, tennis and paddle courts, and are pleased to offer their gastronomic specialities.

#### **TOURS**

#### DOWNTOWN

This circuit allows visitors to appreciate the features of the architecture of Mar del Plata and its Civic Center.

#### 1. COMPLEJO CASINO - GRAN HOTEL PROVINCIAL (CASINO RESORT)

Located on Bv. Marítimo P.P. Ramos Boulevard between Las Heras and Rivadavia Streets, this casino, together with the rock sea lions, is the classic image of Mar del Plata. What is particularly attractive about this place is that, from its esplanade, you can get a panoramic view of the main beaches. The Casino Central hosts a big hall with roulettes, baccarat, black jack, poker, dice and slot machines.

#### 2. DANCING WATERS FOUNTAIN

This is a spectacular fountain of 40 meters in diameter offers an amazing show of light and sound. It features waters dancing to the rhythm of six different melodies specially created by Lito Vitale and staged by Juan Carlos Baglietto. It lies opposite the Casino Central, in Plaza del Milenio square.

#### 3. MUELLE DEL CLUB DE PESCA (PIER)

Declared of patrimonial interest by the General Pueyrredon municipal government, this construction intends to resemble a transatlantic anchored at the esplanade. This effect is further intensified when the place is enlightened at night. In its bow, you can find a pub and a restaurant.

Location: P. Peralta Ramos Boulevard between Luro Avenue and Alberdi Diagonal.

#### 4. PASEO ADOLFO DAVILA (DRIVE)

This drive lies parallel to the coast, between J. B. Alberdi Diagonal and Mitre Street. Its most attractive feature? It has a park covered with grass and beautiful flowers on one of the slopes of Santa Cecilia Hill. As you walk on, you will come across Plaza de las Américas square, the monument honoring the poet Alfonsina Storni and, carved on the rocky wall, the face of the Argentine paleontologist Florentino Ameghino.

#### 5. SAN MARTÍN SQUARE

This is the main square of the city, located between 25 de Mayo St., H. Yrigoyen St., San Martín St. and Luro Ave. In its 4 blocks, there are very old trees and important monuments and sculptures. Surrounding the square are the City Hall, Colón Theatre and Santos Pedro y Cecilia Cathedral, among others. In the central roundabout, over Luro Avenue, stands an imposing monument that pays tribute to General José de San Martín.

#### 6. SANTOS PEDRO Y CECILIA CATHEDRAL

This minor basilica opened its doors in 1905. The Baccarat crystal central chandelier, the vitreaux brought from France and a replica of The Piety of Michelangelo are details not to be overlooked. This cathedral was declared of patrimonial interest by General Pueyrredon municipal government. Location: San Martín 2776

#### 7. PEATONAL SAN MARTÍN (PEDESTRIANIZED AREA)

If you feel like going shopping, Peatonal San Martín is the main commercial street in the city. Along this street, and on its adjacent blocks, there is a great variety of commercial galleries, pubs, restaurants, cinemas, theatres and financial institutions. The pedestrianized area extends from Buenos Aires St. as far as Mitre St.

Eight double rooms and five single rooms are made available to each delegation. One of the single rooms will have a bigger size, which could be used by the physiotherapist of the teams.

All participating teams will arrive to Mar de Plata on Tuesday 9 August 2011, departure from Mar de Plata is depending on the match scheme but in general executed one day after the last match.

#### **Transportation and Arrival**

The teams arriving at Ezeiza's International Airport (Buenos Aires) will be transported by modern busses with on board service up to Mar del Plata, in a trip of approximately five hours of duration and at the expense of the organization.

Every team will have its own bus. The same bus will be the internal mean of transport during the World Championship. Personnel of our Federation will wait for the teams and will lead them to the busses as soon as they have passed through customs.

#### Meals

The participating teams have the right to four meals per day – breakfast, lunch, snack (on matchdays only), dinner.

#### **Meeting rooms**

The organiser will reserve meeting rooms for the teams and provide the necessary furniture and technical equipment free of charge. The meeting rooms for the teams shall dispose of a screen, a projector and a DVD player.

#### Player eligibility

Players born in 1992 or later are eligible to play.

All players are subject to the Eligibility Code for handball players. For proof of citizenship, players must show a passport, which will be checked by the Commission of Organising and Competitions (COC) before the start of the World Championship. The minimum age for participation according to the IHF Regulations is 16.

#### **Team registration**

Up to 28 players and the remainder as officials (stating their function) shall be registered with the Head Office in Basle as follows:

provisionally: one month (17 June 2011) before the World Championship at the latest (28 players at

most) to the organiser as well as the IHF Head Office

definitively: one hour before the Technical Meeting to the responsible IHF representative (16

players taken from the provisional list). Registration must be executed on the relevant

IHF form.

If a team has registered less than 16 players, it may register one additional player during the World Championship.

<u>During</u> the WCh each team may replace up to two players (against two players indicated in the provisional list) at any time. It means that every team may replace <u>a maximum</u> of two players at any time during the competition (<u>max two 'transactions'</u>). These two players may be replaced against players indicated in the provisional delegation list ('list of 28').

Procedure for late registration or substitution of one or several players:

New players must be orally registered to the Competition Management at 9 am on the respective match day at the latest. A written registration and a proof of citizenship (passport, etc.) shall follow one hour before the match at the latest. The <u>official IHF form</u> must be used





Registration on the IHF form for that very purpose (see attached form) must contain the following information in English:

- a) Officials
  Last name, first name, date of birth, gender, function in the delegation and indication of the officials (using letters A, B, C, D, E, F)
- Players
   Player's number, last name, first name, date of birth, club, height, weight, number of international games and number of goals scored (in the corresponding WCh category).
- Players' clothing
   Colour of first and second set of clothing, separately for shirts and shorts; goalkeepers' first and second set of clothing

Players who have not officially registered by the date stipulated shall not be allowed to play in the competition. Please be notified that it is not allowed to take the role as both a player and official simultaneously.

#### Players' clothing

Players' clothing worn at the 2011 Men's Youth World Championship shall be subject to the Regulations for IHF Competitions and the Equipment Manual respectively.

Each team shall dispose of two sets of clothing in different colours.

- a) One set of light-coloured shirts and one set of light-coloured shorts;
- b) One set of dark-coloured shirts and one set of dark-coloured shorts;
- c) Three differently coloured shirts for the goalkeeper (In one match the same colour of all goalkeepers' shirts is needed.)
- d) One colour should very clearly cover the major part of the shirt.

The players' shirts shall bear the player's number as prescribed below.



If the players' shirts shall bear the player's name, it must be displayed as prescribed below.







#### **Competition Management**

The Competition Management is responsible for the orderly management of the event, in close cooperation with the organiser. It gives advice and makes all the necessary decisions during the event, with the exception of disciplinary decisions. It is also responsible for the appointment of Officials, Technical Delegates and Referees. The teams may contact the IHF hotel (details as below) to reach the Competition Management.

#### Rules of the Game / Competition related regulations

Matches shall be played according to the current Rules of the Game.

As you may know, the IHF Council adopted changes to the Rules of the Game, which had been put forward to the Congress for ratification. At the Men's Youth World Championship 2011 the following <u>regulations</u> will apply.

16 players may be put in per match

16 players may be put in per match at World Championships and related qualifying rounds.

#### Half-time break

The half-time break at the Men's Youth World Championship 2011 shall be 15 minutes.

#### Team-Time Out

According to Rule 2:10 and Clarification 3 of the Rules of the Game each team has the right to receive a maximum of three team time-outs during regular playing time but not during overtime. No more than two team time-outs may be granted in each half of the regular playing time. Between two team time-outs of a team, the opponent must be at least once in possession of the ball. 3 green cards, bearing numbers 1, 2, and 3 respectively, are available for each team. The teams receive cards bearing numbers '1' and '2' in the first half of the game and the cards no. 2 and no. 3 in the second half provided they received no more than one team time-out in the first half. In case they received two team time-outs in the first half, they receive only green card no. 3.

Within the last 5 minutes of the regular playing time only one team time-out per team is allowed.





#### **Technical Meeting**

A Technical Meeting with the team officials of the participating delegations, the organiser and the IHF representatives shall be held on 10 August 2011 at 9.00am at the Team Hotel to provide all necessary information and to settle organisational, technical and financial issues.

The teams have to bring all **players' passports** and a sample of their **players' uniform** sets to the Technical Meeting. Moreover they are to submit the **definitive registration list** by use of the IHF form. May we point out once again that only players indicated in the provisional registration list submitted to the IHF may be included in the definitive registration list.

#### Official balls

Balls of IHF partner Select will be used at the Men's Youth World Championship. All participating teams received 10 balls in advance to get familiar with the balls.

#### IHF representatives

The IHF Referees appointed to the individual matches will only be announced on the relevant matchday. The Technical Delegates and the Referees will be informed accordingly in the morning of the relevant matchday at 10 o'clock. The teams and the general public may read the nominations on the IHF website (www.ihf.info) at 11 o'clock.

#### Video recordings

Generally speaking all teams are allowed to take video recordings, although some restrictions may be necessary on account of the space available. The organiser shall provide a special place in the hall for the person taking the video.

One person from each team is allowed to take video recordings at the hall. Recordings may only be used for internal purposes or for developing team tactics and must not be commercially exploited.

#### Match DVDs


The organiser undertakes to record the matches. One match DVD shall be available for the teams concerned free of charge. Further DVD copies may be purchased at a price of CHF 30.--.

#### Match evaluation

#### **Preliminary Round**

The preliminary round is played in groups. Matches shall be evaluated as follows:

- each match won = 2 points
- each match drawn = 1 point for each team
- each match lost = no points

Teams are ranked according to the total number of points gained.

If two or more teams have gained the same number of points after the group matches have been completed, classification is decided as follows:

- results in points between the teams concerned;
- goal differences in the matches between the teams concerned;
- greater number of plus goals in the matches between the teams concerned.

If the teams are still equal, a decision is made between those teams with an equal number of points as follows:

- goal difference is subtracted in all matches
- greater number of plus goals in all matches

If classification still is not possible, a draw shall decide. The IHF representative on site shall execute the draw, if possible in the presence of the 'responsible team officials'. If the 'responsible team official' cannot be present, other co-workers selected by the IHF shall take part.

#### Placement Round, Placement Matches, Quarter-Finals, Semi-Finals and Finals

After completion of the preliminary rounds, all matches shall be played in accordance with the knock-out system.

In case of a draw at the end of the regular playing time, after a break of five (5) minutes, a first overtime period of 2 x 5 minutes shall be played, changing sides halfway through with a one-minute break in-between. Provisions to the contrary set for individual tournaments shall be given priority.

If the match should still not be decided after this overtime period, after a break of 5 minutes, a second overtime period of 2 x 5 minutes shall be played, changing ends halfway through with a one minute break in-between.





Should the match still not be decided after the second overtime period, it is decided with 7m penalty throws in accordance with Rule 2:2 of the Rules of the Game.


In case of a draw at the end of the regular playing time of placement round 13<sup>th</sup>-16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>-20<sup>th</sup> and in placement matches 11<sup>th</sup>/12<sup>th</sup>, 13<sup>th</sup>/14<sup>th</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup>/16<sup>th</sup>, 17<sup>th</sup>/18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup>/20<sup>th</sup>, 7m throws shall be executed to decide the match in accordance with Rule 2:2 of the Rules of the Game.

#### Cancellation or discontinuation of match

If the match is cancelled or discontinued, the Competition Management shall decide on further action.







# Television, Media and Advertising





#### TV rights

The IHF granted all TV and marketing rights to the organiser. TV coverage of the championship will be provided. Further details will be announced on site.

#### **Press conference**

A post-match press conference will take place approximately 15 minutes after the end of each match in the press conference room, located close to other media areas. A coach and a player from each team will attend the press conference conducted in English.

#### Advertising on sportswear


Rights in respect of advertising on sportswear are laid down in the Regulations for Advertising and the Equipment Manual.

#### The participants shall bear the following costs:

#### a) Travel expenses

The entire delegation's travel expenses for the outward journey to the first venue and for the return trip from the last venue.

#### b) Visa costs

The participating delegations shall bear all visa-relevant costs.

#### c) Registration fee

The participating nations shall pay the IHF a registration fee of CHF 500.- no later than 20 June 2011.

#### d) Participation fee

The participants shall pay a participation fee of CHF 100.- per person (official delegation members) and day of stay during the official WCh period. The corresponding sum is due on <u>20 June 2011</u>.

#### e) Fixed deposit

By the deadline fixed for payment, all participating teams must pay to the IHF, at the same time as the registration fee, a deposit of CHF 5,000.-, which will be taken on account or repaid. If a registering federation has the uncharged sum of CHF 5,000.- on its IHF account, this may be used as the fixed deposit by 20 June 2011.

#### Accident and sickness insurance

The federations taking part in World Championships are obliged to insure all delegation members, i.e. all players and all officials, against accident and sickness, at their own cost. The organiser and the IHF shall not be held liable for any accidents that occur or any sickness.

#### Days of stay

When calculating the days of stay, the number of days is generally counted from 12 noon on the day of arrival to 12 noon on the day of departure, i.e. although the days of arrival and departure make up two calendar days, they represent only one fee-paying day. (Additional meals - on the day of arrival possibly breakfast, on the day of departure possibly lunch and/or dinner - shall be paid for in addition.)





#### Additional days of stay

The participating teams may, with the organiser's agreement, arrive earlier or leave later but must bear additional costs themselves. The cost for additional days of official delegation members (16 players, 5 officials in eight double rooms and five single rooms) is CHF 100.-- (one hundred Swiss francs) during the official WCh period (9-21 August 2011).

For additional days of stay outside the WCh period the organiser fixed a fee of CHF 150.- per person. The named amount has to be paid to the Organiser by 10 July 2011.

#### **Additional participants**

The organiser has to guarantee accommodation for 23 persons at most provided the participating federation bears the cost of one or two additional persons itself. The cost for additional persons for the duration of the World Championship is CHF 150.- per person and day.

With the organiser's agreement the delegation may consist of more than 23 persons. The participating federation shall agree on further delegation members by 10 July 2011 at the latest. The organiser will not be able to guarantee accommodation for persons registered past the named deadline.

The cost for additional days and delegation members shall be paid into the bank account of the Argentine Handball Federation by 10 July 2011.

The following costs shall be borne by the organiser:

#### **Expenses in the host country**

All expenses arising within the host country in connection with the games. The Teams that arrive to Ezeiza's International Airport (Buenos Aires), will be transported by Modern and Wide Buses up to the Mar del Plata City, in a trip of approximately five hours duration at the expense of the organization. In the above mentioned Bus they will count with show restraint, drunk, and entertainment. One Bus for each Team. The same Bus will be the internal transport during the World Championship. Personnel of our Federation will wait for the Teams, and will lead them up to the Buses as soon as they have spent the Custom
