# Denmark's effective pivot play

### Video clip 4

... At the start of a set move the Pivot positions himself between OR and RH defenders. When the LW moves towards the middle he blocks his team-mate's defender from following him. Then after freeing himself, receives an accurate jump pass from the LB and can turn towards the goal.



### Video clip 5

... When Spain changes to an open 5:1, 3:2:1 zone defence the Pivot positions himself on the left side of the attack and by constantly occupying at least two defenders he tries to open up penetrable gaps for the backs. Once again, the patient attack causes the defenders to lose concentration for a moment and the attackers are able to capitalise the situation with an unexpected pass from the CB which the P is able to convert into a goal.





## Video clip 6

... In the last minutes of the match Denmark is winning but they are in numerical inferiority (5vs6) and the Pivot takes his position on the right side of the attack. Taking advantage of his height, he stretches his arms out and catches a quick and high positioned pass from the CB.
