Tbilisi



Tbilisi is an economic, political and cultural centre of Georgia, which offers lots of fun for locals and tourists. The city was founded by the Georgian King in the 5th century and became the capital in the 6th century. With its rich History and diversity of nationalities living in this part of the Caucasus, various architectural styles can be found here. In the centre you can see the modern avenues and old narrow streets, particularly interesting for tourists can be a medieval town.

Tbilisi is increasingly becoming an important transit route for trade projects and global enterprises, as it is located at the crossroads of Asia and Europe. Tourism is growing rapidly, the construction of new buildings and 5-star hotels are in full swing. In the city there are many fast-food restaurants such as MCDonalds or Burger King, but also many small markets that sell fresh fruits and vegetables can be found.

There is a huge variety of bars, restaurants and luxury hotels, but if you are looking for a cheap accommodation, it will not be a problem. In public places, you can enjoy traditional Georgian cuisine and a cup of coffee.

Rustaveli Avenue is one of the most famous places in the city with a number of museums, theaters, restaurants and shopping centers. In the adjacent areas to Rustaveli among the most interesting sights can be identified Narikala fortress, Sioni Cathedral, Tbilisi opera and ballet theatre, Vorontsov Palace, Sameba Cathedral, museums and other important places.

Education and culture: The city has 200 schools and nearly 100 higher education institutions, students come to study here from different countries. Georgian Medcial University is known throughout the world. Newly refurbished Tbilisi Opera and Ballet theatre, Rustaveli, Drama, Marjanishvili Drama theatres are offering classical and modern performances in their beautiful venues.

Sports: In 2015 a number of new sports facilities were built for the European Youth Olympic Festival "Tbilisi 2015" and together with the already existing halls, stadiums and tennis courts, the city provides excellent opportunities for hosting tournaments and competitions at National and International level. Among them is the New Sport palace – Olympic Palace", a playing venue for the 2016 IHF/EHF Women's Challenge Trophy and 2016 EHF M18 Championship, Division 2 and now for the 2017 Men's Youth (U19) World Championship.

The IHF Congress awarded the 2017 Men's Youth (U19) World Championship to the Handball Federation of Georgia.


24 national teams have qualified for the 2017 World Championship. They are entitled to take part provided they have fulfilled their obligations towards the IHF.

Player eligibility

The minimum age to participate at the Men's Youth (U19) World Championship is 15 years, the maximum age is 19 years; meaning a player eligible to participate has to turn 15 years on the day of his first match at the latest and must not exceed the age of 19 years in the year of the World Championship.

All players are subject to the Eligibility Code for handball players. For proof of citizenship, players must show a passport, which will be checked by the Commission of Organising and Competition (COC) before the start of the World Championship.

Non-appearance

Non-appearance is subject to clause 2.8. of the Regulations for IHF Competitions.

Team registration

Up to 28 players and the remainder as officials (stating their function) shall be registered with the Head Office in Basle as follows:

- provisionally: one month (08 July 2017) before the World Championship at the latest (28 players at most) to the IHF Head Office by use of the relevant IHF form.
- definitively: one hour before the Technical Meeting to the responsible IHF representative (16 players taken from the provisional list). Registration must be executed on the relevant IHF form.

Each team may replace a maximum of three players (against three players indicated in the provisional list) during the entire tournament (e.g. each team may put in three new players or may put in a player who has already been replaced once), i.e. the 'list of 16' may be changed three times at most. Players may be replaced against players indicated in the provisional delegation list ('list of 28') only.



If a team has registered less than 16 players, it may register one additional player during the World Championship.

Procedure for late registration or substitution of one or several players

New players must be orally registered with the Competition Management or the respective IHF delegate in the respective venue no later than 9 am on the respective match day. A written registration and a proof of citizenship (passport, etc.) shall follow one hour before the match at the latest. The official IHF form (see Annexe) must be used.

Registration on the IHF form for that very purpose (see Annexe) must contain the following information in English:

- a) Officials
Officials (who must not be changed during the entire competition) surname, first name, date of birth, nationality, gender, function within the delegation and indication of the officials (by use of letters A, B, C, D, E)
- b) Players
Player's number, last name, first name, date of birth, club, height, weight, position (GK=Goalkeeper, LW=Left Wing, RW=Right Wing, LB=Left Back, RB=Right Back, CB=Centre Back, L=Line Player/Pivot), number of international games and number of goals scored (in the corresponding category).
- c) Players' clothing
Colour of first and second set of clothing, separately for shirts and shorts; goalkeepers' first, second and third set of clothing.

Players who have not officially been registered by the date stipulated shall not be allowed to play in the competition. Please be notified that it is not allowed to take the role as both a player and official simultaneously.

Players' clothing

Players' clothing worn at the 2017 Men's Youth (U19) World Championship shall be subject to the IHF Regulations.

Players' uniforms

All the court players on a handball team must wear identical uniforms. The combination of colours and design of one team must clearly distinguish from the colours and design of the opposing team.

Players must wear sports shoes.

It is not permitted to wear objects that could be dangerous to the players. This includes, for instance, head protection, face masks, bracelets, watches, rings, visible piercings, necklaces or chains, earrings, glasses without restraining bands or with solid frames, or any other objects which could be dangerous (Rulebook 17:3).



Flat rings, small earrings and visible piercings may be allowed, as long as they are taped over in such a way that they are no longer deemed dangerous to other players. Headbands are allowed, as long as they are made of soft, elastic material.

Players who do not meet the aforementioned rule will not be allowed to take part until they have corrected the problem.

Colours

Each team must possess two (2) differently coloured sets of players' uniform, including at least:

- a) one (1) set of light-coloured shirts and one set of light-coloured shorts
- b) one (1) set of dark-coloured shirts and one set of dark-coloured shorts
- c) three (3) differently coloured shirts for the goalkeeper.

One colour should very clearly cover the major part of the shirt.

All players of a team used on the goalkeeper position must wear the same colour that distinguishes them from the court players of both teams and the goalkeeper(s) of the opposing team.

All goalkeepers of one team must wear the same shirt colour.

The colour of the players' numbers shall differ from the main colour.

In each match one team shall wear light-coloured shirts and the other team dark-coloured shirts.

The uniform sets (named 1st and 2nd in order of preference) of the teams shall appear on the team list.

At the initial Technical Meeting of the IHF competition, each delegation is obliged to show the two differently coloured sets of uniforms (court players and three as regards the goalkeeper).

The colours have to be decided at the initial Technical Meeting. The decision of colours in each match will be taken with participation of the team representatives and the IHF Technical Delegates. In case of disagreement regarding the colours the team named first has the right to choose the colour.

After completion of the preliminary round a second Technical Meeting might be held in which the colours for the eighth-finals and the placement round shall be decided. If no Technical Meeting is held, the colours for all remaining matches will be fixed by the Competition Management.

Players' numbers

Players must wear clearly legible numbers, the figures being placed at least 20cm high on the back and at least 10cm high on their chest. The numbers shall be in a different colour from the main colour. Numbers between 1 and 99 shall be used.

During the entire IHF competition, each player must wear the same number, regardless of his position (goalkeeper or court player).



Players' names

The player's surname or popular name, that is identical to that indicated in the team list, must be displayed, in clearly legible 7cm high (minimum) capital letters, above the player's number on the back of the shirt. The names must be written in Roman letters. The teams are responsible for the application of the names.



Approval procedure

The players' uniforms shall be presented to the IHF in good time for examination. The teams participating in the 2017 Men's Youth (U19) World Championship must forward a sample or coloured photos of the uniforms they want to use in the competition to the IHF Head Office.

The nations are obliged to bring with them only such approved uniforms for the tournament concerned. The teams are obliged to wear the uniforms approved for the match in question. Before the start of the match the IHF Official shall make sure that the teams on the court wear the uniforms approved for the match in question.

Players' clothing during official presentation

During the official presentation prior to the matches all players of one team shall wear consistent clothing (all players wearing tracksuits or all players dressed in players' clothing or a combined solution are possible).

Identification of federation (emblem, national flag or name of the country) displayed on the shirt

Federations shall display the federation's emblem or the national flag at chest level on the front of the shirt. Federations are entitled to place the name of the country on the back of the shirt below the player's number in the event that the federations are not using their right of placing advertising in this area.



Team officials' clothing

The team officials in the substitution area must be uniformly dressed in sportswear or civilian clothing. Colours which may cause confusion with the court players of the opposing team are not allowed (see Substitution Area Regulations 3).

Walk-in and presentation in numerical order

For the walk-in and the presentation before the start of the match, players are kindly requested to line up in numerical order with the team captain coming first after the country's flag and all other players then follow in ascending numerical order (1-99). Please note that this order needs to be maintained during player's presentation and during the national anthem.

Alternatively, teams may set up an individual order. Should this be the case, a corresponding list needs to be submitted at the Technical meeting, providing exact information in which order the players will line-up. The same order needs to be maintained throughout the tournament.



Competition Management

The Competition Management is responsible for the orderly management of the event, in close cooperation with the organiser. It gives advice and makes all the necessary decisions during the event, with the exception of disciplinary decisions. It is also responsible for the appointment of Officials, Technical Delegates and referees.

Rules of the Game / Competition-related regulations

Matches shall be played according to the current IHF Rules of the Game (released: 01 July 2016).

Technical Meeting

An initial Technical Meeting with the team officials of the participating delegations, the organiser and the IHF representatives shall be held on 07 August 2017 at 20:00 at Hualing Hotel for the teams of PR Groups A and B and at the IHF Hotel (Radisson Blu Tbilisi) for the teams of PR Groups C and D to provide all necessary information and to settle organisational, technical and financial issues.

The teams have to bring all **players' passports** and a sample of their **players' uniform sets** to the Technical Meeting. Moreover they are to submit the **definitive registration list** by use of the IHF form. May we point out once again that only players indicated in the provisional registration list submitted to the IHF may be included in the definitive registration list.

Juridical bodies

According to the IHF Regulations, the Disciplinary Commission and Jury shall be responsible for settling disputes at international events (Olympic Games, World Championships and World Cups).

The Disciplinary Commission shall act as the first stage of appeal and handle protests filed at international events against rulings and actions both on and off the field (IHF Legal Provisions, Article 2, IHF Appeal Authorities, 2.1 Disciplinary Commission and Jury).

The Jury will handle cases of recourse against Disciplinary Commission rulings. They will have the final word as the second stage of appeal during international events.

Disciplinary Commission and Jury shall be guided by the following underlying principles when making judgement:

- a) Referee determinations on facts shall be final.
- b) Breach of the rules or unjustified action by referees, scorekeepers, timekeepers, technical delegates and officials can only give rise to a replay if the appeal authority judges the consequences to be decisive for the outcome of the game.

Protests

A protest may be made against decisions and occurrences at the 2017 Men's Youth (U19) World Championship during and outside the matches, up to one hour after completion of the match and against payment of CHF 500.–, to be made at the same time.

The Disciplinary Commission shall deal with the protest (see also Legal Provisions and the Regulations concerning Penalties and Fines).

The reasoning for the protest must be stated in writing no later than two hours after the end of the match and submitted to the Disciplinary Commission in one of the three IHF languages.



The Disciplinary Commission shall decide on the protest no later than five hours after the end of the match, including possible disqualification of players or teams, and shall determine the extent of the fine or penalty.

Appeals

An appeal may be made against the decision of the Disciplinary Commission up to two hours after receipt of the decision, and with payment of CHF 1,500.– at the same time. The Jury shall deal with the appeal, and its decision shall be final. The Jury decision shall be made and announced within 4 hours (see also the Legal Provisions and the Regulations concerning Penalties and Fines.)

Match evaluation and determination of places

Preliminary Round

The preliminary round is played in groups. Matches shall be evaluated as follows:

- each match won = 2 points
- each match drawn = 1 point for each team
- each match lost = no points

Teams are ranked according to the total number of points gained.

If two or more teams have gained the same number of points after the group matches have been completed, classification is decided as follows:

- results in points between the teams concerned;
- goal differences in the matches between the teams concerned;
- greater number of plus goals in the matches between the teams concerned.

If the teams are still equal, a decision is made between those teams with an equal number of points as follows:

- goal difference is subtracted in all matches
- greater number of plus goals in all matches



If classification still is not possible, a draw shall decide. The IHF representative on site shall execute the draw, if possible in the presence of the 'responsible team officials'. If the 'responsible team official' cannot be present, other co-workers selected by the IHF shall take part.

Eighth-Finals, Quarter-Finals, Semi-Finals and Finals

After completion of the preliminary round, all matches shall be played in accordance with the knock-out system.

In case of a draw at the end of the regular playing time, after a break of five (5) minutes, a first overtime period of 2 x 5 minutes shall be played, changing sides halfway through with a one-minute break in-between. Provisions to the contrary set for individual tournaments shall be given priority.

If the match should still not be decided after this overtime period, after a break of 5 minutes, a second overtime period of 2 x 5 minutes shall be played, changing ends halfway through with a one minute break in-between.

Should the match still not be decided after the second overtime period, it is decided with 7m penalty throws in accordance with Rule 2:2 of the Rules of the Game.

Placement round / Placement matches

In case of a draw at the end of the regular playing time of all matches 7m penalty throws shall be executed to decide the match in accordance with Rule 2:2 of the Rules of the Game.

Placement matches 9-16

The losers of the Eighth-Finals will compete in the placement matches 9-16.

For this purpose a separate ranking of the teams concerned will be set up according to the following criteria:

- a) number of points gained against the teams ranked 1st-4th in the preliminary round in their group;
- b) if two or more teams have gained the same number of points the goal difference in the games mentioned under a) is decisive for the classification;
- c) if two or more teams have gained the same number of points as well as the same goal difference in the games mentioned under a) a decision on the classification is made based on the greater number of plus goals in these games;
- d) if two or more teams have gained the same number of points, the same goal difference and the same number of plus goals in the games mentioned under a) the classification of these teams is decided by lot through the competition management

Teams ranked 1st and 2nd in the corresponding ranking will play for places 9/10; teams ranked 3rd and 4th for places 11/12, etc.

Placement matches (9-16)

15/16: 7th ranked – 8th ranked*

13/14: 5th ranked – 6th ranked*

11/12: 3rd ranked – 4th ranked*

9/10: 1st ranked – 2nd ranked*

*according to the above mentioned ranking

In case of a draw at the end of the regular playing time direct 7m penalty throws shall be used to decide a winner in accordance with Rule 2:2 of the Rules of the Game.



Cancellation or discontinuation of match

If the match is cancelled or discontinued, the Competition Management shall decide on further action.

Official balls

Balls of IHF partner Molten will be used at the 2017 Men's Youth (U19) World Championship. Every participating team has received 10 balls in advance to get familiar with the balls.

Anti-Doping

Doping tests will again be carried out at the 2017 Men's Youth (U19) World Championship. Further information will be provided by the IHF Anti-Doping Unit (ADU). Please contact the ADU for further queries you may have.

LOGISTICS AND ORGANISATIONAL MATTERS



Accommodation

All teams will be accommodated in hotels approved by the International Handball Federation, as outlined under 1.3.

Eight double rooms and five single rooms will be available for each delegation. One of the single rooms will have a bigger size to be used by the physiotherapist of the team.

Internet access free of charge shall be available at the hotel.

Duration of stay / Arrival and departure

The teams shall arrive on Monday, 07 August 2017. Please note that rooms will not be available before noon on 07 August 2017, meaning should your team arrive early morning and should you wish to have the rooms available upon arrival, additional fees may arise.

Departure depends on the match scheme, but in general is effected one day after the last match. Earlier arrival and later departure is possible. Please check with the organiser and refer to Section 5 of the present announcement.

Teams participating in the placement matches 17-24 and 9-16 will leave on 18 August 2017. Departure for all other teams is 21 August 2017.

Meals

The participating teams have the right to four meals per day: breakfast, lunch, snack (on match days only), dinner. Requests in terms of special diet etc. should be communicated to the OC directly.

Meeting rooms

The organiser will reserve meeting rooms for the teams and provide the necessary furniture and technical equipment free of charge. The meeting rooms for the teams shall dispose of a screen + projector / TV set and a video player.

Laundry

Laundry service is available in all team hotels. The OC will inform about the corresponding procedure on site. Price is 3USD per kilo.

Awards and ceremonies

Medals and certificates shall be awarded to the three top teams as follows:

- 1st place and World Champion (gold)
- 2nd place (silver)
- 3rd place (bronze)

On the podium a total of 25 persons are allowed (players who have participated in the World Championship and team officials A-E).

Closing banquet

Depending on the travel schedule of the teams, the organiser may prepare a closing banquet for the participating delegations and the IHF representatives. Further information will be provided on site.

The participants shall bear the following costs:

a) Travel expenses

The entire delegation's travel expenses for the outward journey to the first venue and for the return trip from the last venue.

b) Visa costs

The participating delegations shall bear all visa-relevant costs.

c) Registration fee

The participating nations shall pay the IHF a registration fee of CHF 500.-.

d) Participation fee

The participants shall pay the IHF a participation fee of CHF 110.-- per person (official delegation members) and day of stay during the official WCh period.

e) Fixed deposit

By the deadline fixed for payment, all participating teams must pay the IHF, at the same time as the registration fee a deposit of CHF 5,000.-, which will be taken on account or repaid. If a registering federation has the uncharged sum of CHF 5,000.- on its IHF account, this may be used as the fixed deposit.

Accident and sickness insurance

The federations taking part in World Championships are obliged to insure all delegation members, i.e. all players and all officials, against accident and sickness, at their own cost. The organiser and the IHF shall not be held liable for any accidents that occur or any sickness.

Days of stay

When calculating the days of stay, the number of days is generally counted from 12 noon on the day of arrival to 12 noon on the day of departure, i.e. although the days of arrival and departure make up two calendar days, they represent only one fee-paying day. (Additional meals - on the day of arrival possibly breakfast, on the day of departure possibly lunch and/or dinner - shall be paid for in addition.)



Additional days of stay

The participating teams may, with the organiser's agreement, arrive earlier or leave later provided they bear additional costs themselves. The price for additional days of official delegation members (16 players, 5 officials in eight double rooms and five single rooms) is CHF 110.-- during the official WCh period and also outside the official WCh period.

Additional participants

The organiser has to guarantee accommodation for **30** persons at most provided the participating federation bears the costs for additional delegation members itself. The price for additional persons for the duration of the World Championship is CHF 110.- per person and day.

The participating federations shall inform the IHF and the organiser on further delegation members until the announced deadline. The organiser will not be able to guarantee accommodation for persons registered past the named deadline.

All costs for additional days of stay and/or additional participants need to be paid to the bank account of the Georgian National Handball Federation as organiser of the event (please refer to 5.1. for the corresponding bank details).

Expenses in the host country

Board and lodging
